This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows any person to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Product to be used:

FOLICUR 430SC FUNGICIDE

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing 430 g/L TEBUCONAZOLE as their only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
CARROTS	POWDERY MILDEW (<i>Erysiphe heraclei</i>) SUPPRESSION ONLY	Apply 580 mL product per hectare.

Critical Use Comments:

- Tebuconazole give useful suppression of powdery mildew only.
- Apply at the first sign of disease ensuring good coverage of all leaf surfaces in 400-600 L water per hectare Use the higher water volume in dense or well grown crops.
- Do not apply more than 3 applications per crop at 14-21 day intervals by ground based application equipment only.

Withholding Period:

DO NOT HARVEST FOR 21 DAYS AFTER THE FINAL APPLICATION.

Jurisdiction:

NSW, SA and TAS only.

Additional Conditions:

This permit provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.

Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit.

To avoid crop damage: The sensitivity of some species and varieties of the crops to be treated under this permit has not been fully evaluated. It is advisable, therefore, to only treat a small number of plants to ascertain their reaction before treating the whole crop.

Export of Produce: Exported produce or animals must have appropriate residue tolerance limits established in the importing countries and any residues must not exceed the tolerance limits.

Re-entry Period;

Do not re-enter treated areas within one week (7 days) of spraying.
